A MESSAGE FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

First, a special thank you to Brad Gran for sharing his gifts with us this Sunday. His willingness to stand in was a blessing to us all, and we are fortunate to have the Grans as a part of our congregation.

Most every Sunday, we recite the Apostle's Creed as a part of our worship service. As we do, we state that we believe in "the holy catholic church," that is, one, unified, universal church. It can be a very hard idea to believe in, especially when there is disagreement in our own denominations and in our own pews!

However, the catholic nature of the church is greater than denominational and theological divisions. It is a focus on the things that bind us together – the love and grace of Jesus Christ and a call to share this good news and make disciples of those around us. The idea of *that* is something that's easier to understand.

Generally, the first Sunday of October is set aside to observe World Communion Sunday. Because of fall break and missing clergy, we will be celebrating this special day this week. Sometimes the liturgical calendar just doesn't match our own.

That's how we'll express our idea of the universal church and the love of Jesus this week – through the celebration of the sacrament of Holy Communion, albeit belatedly. We will take part in the Last Supper Jesus shared with his disciples and embrace the new meaning of the covenant between God and all of us, just as Christians across the world have done for generations.

We'll be together as the Body of Christ, recognizing and celebrating that we are united through the gospel and the gifts of God - the life, grace, and love given to *all* of us. I hope to see you there.
