A MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

I recently informed our Bishop, District Superintendent, and Staff Parish Relations Committee that I intend to retire at the end of this calendar year. My last Sunday will be December 16th. Mid-year appointment changes are not unusual in our system. They occur every year, and our Bishop and Cabinet will make a mid-year appointment to fill the vacancy.

I'm grateful for the privilege of serving at FUMC for over five years. I'm especially thankful for the faithfulness and generosity of the congregation. I also appreciate your kindness to me and my family during my tenure here.

As with any major decision, numerous factors impacted this one. For one thing, I've been engaged in church work for forty years. That's a long time! So, I'm ready to do some other things beyond church employment. Most important, I want to spend more time with family and friends. Also high on my list are numerous writing projects, both fiction and non-fiction. I have a long list of other non-work activities I want to pursue while my overall health is still good. And I may serve a part-time or interim pastorate.

I'm also weary of struggling with a three decade long vocal disorder. I live in chronic vocal pain and fatigue, constantly aggravated by the heavy vocal use that is demanded in a large, fulltime pastorate. That reality played a significant role in this decision.

Also, I think it's time for FUMC to have new senior pastor leadership. Since my arrival over five years ago, I've attempted to implement three major strategies for revitalization at FUMC. They included (1) high energy, celebrative blended worship, including a mix of traditional and contemporary music, along with projection capacity for visual impact in a highly visual world, (2) creating a culture of invitation, where people boldly and regularly invite folks to FUMC, and (3) claiming a niche as a progressive church of "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors" in a community of mostly religious-right churches. However, FUMC has not embraced these strategies. It's certainly the right of First Church to decline these particular initiatives. However, avoiding change and maintaining the current status quo will lead to serious decline in the years ahead. Therefore, it's time for a new pastor to bring fresh eyes and attempt new strategies. My hope and prayer is that a new leader will help mobilize fresh directions, leading to new vitality. I care deeply about FUMC and want only good things for your future.

There's plenty of work to do before my departure. So, I won't say much more about this until we get closer to December 16th. But, given my notice to the Bishop, DS and our SPRC, I felt I should share this information with the congregation. Our Staff Parish Committee will consult with the DS about this upcoming transition in the near future, and will share their perspective about FUMC's future senior pastor needs.




Please join us for United Methodist Women's annual Harvest of Blessings on Friday, November 9, from 10 a.m.—1 p.m. in the Christian Life Center.
