### A MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

As most of you know, the United Methodist Church, like many denominations, is currently in conflict over the issue of sexuality. Next February, we will have a called General Conference to find some kind of resolution to this decade's long struggle. Most people believe we'll have some kind of schism. If so, hopefully those who leave will be small in number.

A few weeks ago, our church hosted a listening session on the subject. Large numbers of churches from our District attended and shared their perspective on homosexuality. Although a few people called for grace and inclusion, the vast majority spoke negatively about becoming more inclusive as a denomination. Numerous people even compared homosexuals to pedophiles and murderers. I found the discussion extremely discouraging.

The overwhelming consensus among those who spoke at the listening session is that the Bible condemns homosexual behavior, and that we must not go against the Bible. However, it's not nearly that simple. The Bible only has about seven brief passages on homosexuality. The writers of those texts had no conception of sexual orientation, or of loving monogamous homosexual relationships. We must be extremely careful about using a few isolated Bible verses to condemn all gay people.

For example, the Bible has over three hundred verses that affirm slavery. Large numbers of verses affirm and command the practice of genocide. The Bible says that the penalty for picking up sticks on the Sabbath is execution by stoning. According to the Bible, sassy teenagers are to be executed. The Bible teaches that women are the property of their fathers and husbands. The Bible forbids women to speak in church. The Bible says that divorce for any reason is unacceptable. The Bible even says that mixing different fabrics in clothing is an abomination to God. Most Christians in the  $21^{st}$  century totally ignore all of those passages, for good reasons. However, many of them hold fast to the handful of verses that discourage homosexual behavior. Sadly, people use these verses to support prejudice against gay people, to discriminate against them both in society and church, and to wound them deeply.

Rather than cherry picking a handful of passages that support our prejudices, we must look at the big picture of the Bible, which values love, mercy, grace, inclusion, and justice. And, we must especially pay attention to the teaching and example of Jesus, who never said a word about homosexuality. However, Jesus constantly broke down human barriers. He offered grace, love, and mercy to all (except arrogant and judgmental religious people). And, he included all people into the community of faith.

I have no idea what General Conference will decide next February. And I'll be retired and out of the fray. But I hope and pray that United Methodists will chose inclusion over exclusion, love over hate, and justice over discrimination.
