A MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

All of us have been anxious to resume in-person worship. As pastors and leaders, we feel the weight of balancing safety with our desire for worship together. All of us would prefer things just go back to "normal" but for now we are coping with a "new normal." We look forward to our scheduled dates of Worship in the Park, which are September 20, October 4, and October 25. All park services are at 9 a.m. A great deal of planning, logistics and effort go into every worship experience. Weeks of preparation are required. In addition, each week we film segments of worship for YouTube streaming. It is our new normal for however long Covid-19 continues as a serious public health threat.

Spikes in cases and upward trends in cases are always a concern. Putnam County numbers in recent months are: *May 14 - 204 active cases; *July 18 - 331 active cases; *August 12 - 482 active cases; *August 26 - 562 active cases; *August 29 - 613 active cases; *September 4 - 597 active cases.

As you can see, the trend line is an increase of 200% in two and a half months. A number of our staff persons have been directly exposed to the virus. Over one dozen church members to date either have had or currently do have the virus. ALL of us know someone who has had the virus, currently has it, or is in quarantine. It is a difficult environment to navigate, with a wide range of views, opinions, and emotions all at once.

As your pastor, my primary concern has always been the wellbeing of the whole congregation, especially our most vulnerable members. We are one interconnected community of faith. A similar, weighty concern is that our church NOT become a "super -spreader" in our community by OUR transmission. These concerns have weighed heavily on me as a pastor. Now, six months into COVID-19, we are faced with balancing growing case numbers with the continuing need for our church to worship together. After a great deal of conversation, consideration, prayer, and discernment, we have arrived at a plan for worship that we hope will be manageable, safe, sustainable, and meaningful for those who wish to gather in-person. Our primary obstacle has been our worship space in the sanctuary. Earlier in the year, to accommodate approximately 100+ people safely at one time, we did two services in the same space with cleaning in between. Everything from entry/exit, to cleaning before and after, to airflow and ventilation has to be considered. With this in mind, we will now use two large meeting spaces.

As of November 1, we will offer two in-person worship options: 9 a.m. informal worship in the gym, and 10:55 a.m. traditional worship in the sanctuary. Using these two large spaces, at two different times, with two worship teams, we intend to be able to sustain in-person worship regardless of how events develop this fall and winter. Barring state-wide shutdown of some sort due to the combination of COVID-19 and flu this а winter, we will provide these in-person worship options on an ongoing basis. This is our best way forward.

As a congregation, I ask you to be considerate, prayerful, faithful, mature, loyal, and hopeful. We are all in this together. We share in responsibility for one another and our larger community. I hope you understand my desire to be as responsible as possible for YOUR well-being. As we gather for worship in the park and resume in-person worship November 1, please be responsible by wearing your mask as an act of love for others and if you feel any hint of fever or symptoms, avoid contact with others. With that in mind, we look forward to seeing you all as we worship together.

MEMORIAL GARDEN AND COLUMBARIUM



On September 11, 2016, nearly four years ago, the FUMC Memorial Garden was dedicated. The Memorial Garden is the location of the columbarium, a freestanding hexagonal shaped structure constructed of polished granite with a granite cross on the top. The columbarium features 72 niches, which can hold up to 144 urns. Currently there are 21 niches that have been purchased. The niche fronts are polished granite suitable for engraving. Purchase of a niche includes the urn(s), engraving and perpetual care in the Memorial Garden.

Church member David Vaughn, of Vaughn's Monument Works, has graciously donated the engraving for the niche fronts.

FUMC members or former members and their families are eligible to purchase a niche in the columbarium. The cost is \$4500 for two urns in the niche, \$2500 for a single urn.
