FROM OUR PASTOR

I've been thinking about Billy Graham since his death last week. Like all humans, Graham was imperfect, but all in all, he was a positive influence for faith in America and beyond. His message was full of love, hope and unity. He brought together Catholics, mainline Christians and evangelicals. He reached out to Democrats and Republicans. His crusades were racially integrated. He presented Christianity in a positive light for millions of people. Graham was often listed as one of the top ten most admired men in America. People often referred to Billy Graham as "America's Pastor."

Sadly, many religious leaders since Graham's heyday have presented Christianity in a very different light. Instead of proclaiming love and hope, they spread a message of anger and fear. Instead of unifying people, they divide them. Many are hyper partisan. They often foster hatred towards gays and Muslims.

As you look out at the religious landscape in America, you can see both lifeaffirming faith (love, hope, unity, grace, tolerance), and life-diminishing faith (anger, negativity, division, fear, judgment). Sadly, over the past few decades, lifediminishing faith has become the predominant face of Christianity in America. It's no coincidence that in response, huge numbers of people, especially young adults, have left faith and church in droves. People look at life-diminishing faith and say, "If this is Christianity, I want no part of it."

One of my core goals in life is to try and live out life-affirming faith. And one of my core goals for FUMC is that we serve as an example of a life-affirming community of faith. People need to know there is an alternative to angry, fearful, divisive and judgmental faith. They need to see individuals and churches grounded in Jesus' kind of faith—including love, grace, kindness, compassion, tolerance, and hope. I believe God calls us, both as individuals and as a congregation, to do our best to offer that kind of faith to our community.

After the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible...

After you find a pink slip with your final paycheck...

After your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Stephen Ministers are *the after people*. They are ready to stand alongside you and provide comfort and support for as long after as needed.


