FROM OUR PASTOR

I recently shared an assessment of FUMC with our Staff Parish team. I'd like to share some of that with you in this week's article.

On the one hand, FUMC does many things well and is vital in a lot of areas. We do significant ministry here, both within the congregation and in the community. I'm constantly amazed at the large number of people engaged in service to God, church, and community in this place. Many of our members have rich spiritual lives. We love each other well. Our people are generous with their time and money. We made two important staff hires over the past year and both are doing well (Associate Pastor and Youth Minister). We continue to make progress in our children and youth ministry. We have many strong programs. We experience little conflict. Overall morale is strong. And the list of positives goes on and on.

On the other hand, FUMC, like the vast majority of churches in America, faces real challenges. Our biggest challenge continues to be our inability to effectively reach new people. For example, in spite of significant growth in Cookeville over the past few decades, our membership and attendance remained static. Our median age is double the median age of our community and we have an extremely small number of first time guests. This decades-long lack of evangelism is certainly not unique to FUMC. Most mainline churches struggle with the same problem. The challenge is compounded by recent cultural changes. Fewer people attend church in America than ever before, and those who do attend participate less often. With few exceptions, the overall church in America is in serious decline. Clearly, we are facing strong cultural head winds against evangelistic success. However, part of our challenge at FUMC is the prevailing culture here. Reaching people for Christ and church is not a priority for most of our congregation, and hasn't been for many decades. And we are comfortable with old methods of "doing church" that are not as effective as they used to be. We need to make significant adaptations to thrive in a rapidly changing world, though it will challenge the status quo.

I've come to realize that my primary attempted strategies for revitalizing FUMC, which were extremely effective in my past pastorates (including vibrant blended worship, creating a culture of bold invitation, and claiming our niche as a centrist, open-minded alternative to religious right fundamentalism), have not been embraced by FUMC. These strategies, for whatever reason, have not gained much traction. Therefore, we need to figure out different strategies that will be effective in this unique congregation and community. I will work towards that end in the months ahead, through prayer, dialogue, and discernment with staff and lay leadership, including creating a future directions team to make plans for a more promising future at FUMC.
