JAIL MINISTRY TRAINING

Cookeville FUMC has entered into a partnership with *God's Jail Ministry*, which has a twenty-year history with the Putnam County Jail. Prison ministry has been a cornerstone and tradition of the Methodist church since John Wesley. Our role will consist of helping to expand the number of those who serve on this team, providing weekly opportunities for a scripture and prayer-based ministry to the male inmate population. At some point in the future female members may be needed.

My involvement with the ministry began about a year and a half ago, after it was mentioned in our local newspaper. I had been praying for another way to serve God through an outreach program, and after several attempts I finally connected with the right person. Very soon I found myself in training and actively engaged with *God's Jail Ministry*.

Initially I felt a need to be able to say something meaningful to help the inmates in their suffering. However, I soon realized that as well-intended as this may be, it completely misunderstands the inmates' situation, and the source of true healing. I learned that the healing process often occurs during a group discussion following our presentation of scripture and Gospel messages. It may be assumed that by facilitating a Gospel study group we must be able to address, if not fully explain, the intricacies of the spiritual journey. This is not so. It is, rather, our own attempts at Divine intimacy that are important, not our level of theological understanding. Our mutual and collective stories are compelling. I'm personally impacted by an inmate's story, and so is he when he hears mine. A bond emerges where one can palpably feel that we are, indeed, all children of God. We are ministering to one another. It gives me a much deeper notion of grace and how grace works in all of us, regardless of race, denominational commitments and psychological development.

This is an opportunity to serve in an important and necessary ministry, engaging with a population in great need of receiving God's message of grace and the gift of empathic listening. The ministry takes place every Sunday from approximately 12:30 p.m. until 2:30 p.m. If you are interested, or would like more information, please contact Tamika Parker or Rob Wheeler in the church office at 526-2177.
