FROM OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

There are so many difficult issues brewing right now, and for every one of them we don't have to look far to find a shouting match. Whether it's over dinner or a Facebook post, a fight isn't hard to find. Things can be said that are hurtful and insulting and lead to resentment and damaged relationships.

I recently came across a story that is told about Clara Barton, the founder of the American Red Cross. Barton, it was said, was never one to hold a grudge. One day, she came across someone who had wronged her in the past. Another friend said to her, "Clara, don't you remember?"

"No," Barton said, without hesitation. "I distinctly remember forgetting that."

We can spend a lot of time being specific with the words we use when we fuss at each other. We can expend a lot of energy resenting people who have done things to hurt and harm us. But I hope we can always remember that with God's grace, forgiveness, moving past, and letting go are such a valuable part of our faith.

First, I hope we can keep perspective that the Jesus story is bigger than a political argument, even when we're moved to act for social change.

Second, we must be as intentional about forgiveness as we are about being right. Grudges that we let sit seem to fester and come back to haunt. It can weigh us down and keep us from moving to a brighter place. God's grace gives us the strength to move on.

Hurt comes in many forms. Sometimes it comes to us; sometimes we give it to others. But forgiveness and grace came to us in one form – that of Jesus Christ. I pray we remember that our call is to live is such a way that Christ may be seen in us, no matter what side of the argument - or the pain – we're on.


