FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Dr. Angela Duckworth is a professor of psychology at the University of Pennsylvania. She has written a book titled, *GRIT: The Power of Passion and Perseverance*. Most of her research has focused on how to measure or predict how well students will do in college and careers. West Point hired her to assess incoming cadets to predict who would drop out of the rigorous program and who would persevere. Duckworth's "grit" test proved to be more highly accurate than West Point's "whole candidate score" that included SAT scores and leadership experience. GRIT is a quality that goes much deeper. It is the cultivated ability to cope with adversity and persevere.

While writing her book, Dr. Duckworth flew to Seattle to interview Pete Carroll. He is the former coach of the USC Trojans and is now the head coach of the NFL's Seattle Seahawks. Dr. Duckworth found that Coach Carroll cultivates a distinctive culture as a team. The team has a vision statement. Each player is required to develop their own vision statement as their story within the team story. What makes the vision a reality are specific practices, disciplines and effort. Coach Carroll looks for players who can model and amplify the team vision and values. Practices are filled with the intensity, imitating game situations. Carroll's mantra is: Compete on every play and win. You are either competing, giving it your all... or not. His companion phrase is: You are a Seahawk 24-7. Finish strong. Positive self-talk. Team first. There is a twenty foot tall sign in the lobby of their practice facility that says, "character." The team has a chant they say in practice, on the sideline and in huddles: No whining. No complaining. No excuses. Always protect the team. Carroll himself told Dr. Duckworth he thinks two things make the culture of his team unique: deep support for each other and relentless challenge to grow and improve daily. Each player wears a wristband with the letters: LOB... Love Our Brothers. Coach Carroll knows the power of culture to transform lives.

As I read the story about Coach Carroll, I thought to myself how we as a community of faith are called to be a "community of character." Characterbuilding is about forming a culture that permeates all we are and do and gradually shapes our identity. Our culture could be called a culture of "grace and grit." Love of God and our neighbors is our goal. Sharing the grace of God in the heart of town is our vision. How do your personal vision and values support our shared story and vision? Our practices develop the culture: gathering, welcoming, worshipping, forming, caring and serving. Are you growing in grace every day? Giving discipleship your all? Bringing your best focus, gifts, effort and intensity to following Christ? I hope so. "No whining. No complaining. No excuses. Finish strong!" Go TEAM!
