# FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Sir Francis Drake was a complicated man. His father was a protestant pastor in England at a time of religious upheaval. During what was called the "Bible Rebellion," a young Francis Drake and his family were forced to take shelter in an abandoned shipwreck on the English coast. The time of hardship and faith must have made a huge impact on Drake as a child. He grew up to become a world-renowned ship captain who participated in the defeat of the Spanish Armada, became only the second person in his era to circumnavigate the globe, and even explored the northwest coast of what would later become the state of Oregon in the United States.

Drake was a person of faith, yet he was tainted by the negative aspects of the spirit of his age. He was a pirate, an explorer, a slave-trader, an outlaw in the eyes of some, and a champion for England's colonial expansion in the eyes of others.

Was he a saint? Was he a sinner? Or, was he a mix of saint and sinner? Probably the later, like most of us. He was knighted by Queen Elizabeth of England. He professed to be a Bible-believing Baptist in an era when that profession of faith could be deadly. Unfortunately, he was also a slave-trader who never questioned that practice. He was certainly a man of courage and vision.

One legacy of his complicated life is a unique prayer, recorded in the annals of history. Drake believed in a God of possibility and broad horizons. Whether as a saint, a sinner or a mixture of both, his prayer remains a window to his soul. He was a person who longed for God to challenge him to a bigger, broader faith. He prayed that God would disturb him if his faith became too stagnant. May we pray for such a holy disturbance.
