## FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Hard to believe, but the Holidays are upon us. Thanksgiving and Christmas are such wonderful times of the year. Gatherings abound. I look forward to all our church family gatherings as celebrations unfold.

In the midst of all the "busy-ness" of Christmas, and the business of Christmas, we offer worship and study times that help us truly keep the "Christ" in Christmas. Our Advent study material this year is titled *Almost Christmas*. It uses a Wesleyan theme from our Methodist heritage as its metaphor for seeking depth of meaning and experience at Christmas. John Wesley taught and preached about the difference between the "almost" and the "altogether" Christian. He sought to close the gap between what authentic Christianity offers and how we often fall short of our spiritual potential and calling as Christian disciples.

Over the four weeks of the Advent season, as a time of spiritual preparation for Christmas, the themes we will cover include peace, hope, joy, and love. We all have longings for genuine experiences of these gifts from God in a deeper fulfilling way. I hope you will consider being part of the study during the Sunday School hour each week from December 1-22. I will be offering a study on Monday mornings at 11 a.m. for those who are available during the weekday. My hope is that these studies will prove to be a way our church can enhance your experience of the "Christ" of Christmas.
