After her meeting with us, a new pastor was selected for FUMC at last week's cabinet meeting. The person who was appointed remains anonymous for now, but District Superintendent Parramore and Bishop McAlilly feel strongly that he (I can say he) will be a perfect fit for our congregation.

Unfortunately, our new minister will not be available until February. Initially it was March, but I just received notification yesterday that his start date has been moved forward. At first there was some discussion about having an interim Senior Pastor. However, now with only one month to fill, the committee decided at last night's meeting to proceed with our present staff with the possible addition of a visiting pastor or two during the month.

Please keep the committee, staff, cabinet and our new minister in your prayers as we transition into the new year.
