# FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

How much do you think about the future? No one truly knows the future except God. But, as a local church, it is important to anticipate "God's preferred future" for our life together. Some call that the definition of vision—anticipating God's preferred future. It takes discernment, hope, and clarity about present circumstances combined with anticipated future trends to outline a strategy for fulfilling God's preferred future for our congregation.

Consequences to not anticipating trends can lead to huge changes in our culture. Some examples from the business world include:

- Traditional "land line" Bell Telephone companies did not anticipate the wide-spread use of cell phones.
- Drive-in theatres and hometown movie theatres did not anticipate the availability of movies on cable TV or online streaming services in our homes.
- The last of over 9,000 Blockbuster Video Stores is still open in Bend, Oregon, but the rest closed due to not anticipating the end of VCRs and Bluerays.
- Blackberry was once the leading handheld device in the world just twenty years ago. Now the company is struggling to survive due to the advent of the iPhone.
- Sears was once the largest retailer in America. It was surpassed by Walmart.
  Now, online purchasing has finally brought the historic chain of stores to a
  historic end.

Our entire culture is changing rapidly. Now AI, or "artificial intelligence", is making its way into our lives and homes. Automation is replacing thousands of jobs now accomplished by human beings. The pace of change is accelerating.

There is also change in our moral and spiritual climate. Civility has been replaced by open disrespect between people and groups, rooted in a deterioration of respect for institutions, authority and traditions. Common ground has been replaced by divisiveness where everyone is expected to choose an opposing side. There seems to be very little concern for a shared sense of common decency, truthfulness or virtue. Hatred and division are slowly taking hold of more and more minds and hearts. A religious marketplace has emerged that competes for the attention and attendance of would-be church goers. What once seemed stable is now unstable.

In the last several weeks, I have been sharing some basic principles I hope will ground us as we move into a very different environment than our church has seen in our lifetimes. It is a basic approach to ministry rooted in the vision of "sharing the story of grace in the heart of town—by gathering, welcoming, worshipping, forming, caring, serving and communicating" well. A 2020+ Vision Team is being named to explore where God is leading us next. I ask you to pray for our work, life and ministry together as we anticipate "God's preferred future" for our church. Together, we must navigate an everturning sea of change.
