FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

As we move through the Advent Season toward Christmas, our thoughts turn toward celebrating the birth of Christ. Worship and music are means of grace for each of us that prepares us to receive Christ again, as one preacher expressed it, "into the cradle of our hearts."

As I shared in last Sunday's sermon, Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany all focus this year on themes of light pushing back the darkness. Many of our hymns provide imagery for Christ coming as the light of the world. One of my favorites is *O Little Town of Bethlehem*, written by the famous preacher Phillip Brooks, who became an Episcopal priest and bishop and died at an early age.

Brooks was widely known as the "prince of the pulpit" in his day. His towering height (6'6") truly made him a formidable preaching presence. In 1868, Brooks wanted a new carol to share with the children of his church, Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Philadelphia. Several years before, Phillips had visited the Holy Land. He spent Christmas Eve in Bethlehem worshipping in the Church of the Nativity, and then spent the night in Shepherd's Field. The experience left an indelible impression on Brooks. As a result, Brooks penned the words of the hymn. He asked his organist to set the piece to music. It was first published in 1874, and has become a beloved hymn of Christmas.

This Christmas, may the Christ-child of Bethlehem be born again "in the cradle of your heart." I hope the words of *O Little Town of Bethlehem* kindle a new light of hope, peace, joy, and love in your life.

O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie. Above thy deep and dream-less sleep the silent stars go by; Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light— The hopes and dreams of all the years are met in thee tonight.

How silently, how silently, the wondrous gift is giv'n. So God imparts to human hearts the blessings of his heav'n. No ear my hear his coming, but, in this world of sin, Where meek souls will receive him still the dear Christ enters in...
