On Sunday, August 13, we will recognize the volunteer leaders and facilitators who care deeply about offering the faith-based support groups of GriefShare to our community. These individuals have experienced for themselves the life changing difference participating in a GriefShare group can make. They are so convinced of GriefShare's ability to help those who grieve the loss of a loved one; they commit to helping others find the same hopeful care they've received.

GriefShare began at Cookeville FUMC in August 2009, and has since drawn some 174 participants from throughout the region. Many participants repeat all or part of the 13-week series, finding comfort and peace through the message and support of the group. The participants also represent a diverse group of people from various denominations, or no church at all, who attend the sessions for the comfort and sense of direction that GriefShare affords.

GriefShare meetings are offered throughout the year at various locations in the area, day and evening groups are available.
