Disagreements sometimes change the way we feel about one another, but when we center ourselves with God's grace and the love of Jesus Christ, we find a better way. A way to love and to share mercy and grace and love.

I pray that our harmony is never overtaken by discord - in our church and wherever we go when we leave. And that we open our hearts to everyone, even to those we dislike. Thank you for showing me how to open our doors and to love our neighbors.

DISASTER RESPONSE TEAM IN MARCO ISLAND, FLORIDA



On Sunday, September 17, four members of our Disaster Response Team deployed to Marco Island, Florida, to provide assistance to the survivors of Hurricane Irma. The trip down took eighteen hours and covered 850 miles. Once there the team joined with members of St. Mark's UMC Disaster Response Team and spent five days cutting storm-damaged trees, tarping roofs, and moving debris. Most of the work was located in the poorer section of Goodland, a small fishing village. The residence were excited to see us and thanked us repeatedly for our service. One said, "Now I understand what heaven-sent means". Another resident felt, "Goodland is strong. We will stick together and with your help we will began to put the pieces back together." In one week the team was able to create a connection of community and fellowship with the residents of Goodland. The Wesley United Methodist Church on Marco Island provided housing and food and were very generous and gracious hosts. The two Tennessee teams were the only disaster response teams working on the Island. We returned home on Saturday, September 23. The generous contributions of individuals and churches throughout the Caney Fork River District made this ministry possible. Thank you.
